While the coronavirus pandemic continues to provide challenges around the world, 2022 has seen the return to in-person philatelic exhibitions. We all are excited to be back at in-person exhibitions after two years of uncertainty and disruption, though travel from some countries remains restricted.

We had London 2022, Hunfilex 2022, Helvetia 2022, Capex 2022, Indonesia 2022, Liberec 2022, and Cape Town 2022 philatelic exhibitions.

Some very strong literature exhibits have been on display at these exhibitions including Dr. Henrik Mouritsen's "Danish Postal History 1875-1907", which awarded 98 marks in Helvetia 2022. This exhibit was considered for the Grand Prix International award but unfortunately, the exhibit did not win the GPI award.

SREV and Guidelines

Guidelines C. Digital media says: "...publications that comply with Article 3", it is corrected to Article 2 of SREV.



Long term activities on the Philatelic Literature in connection and support of The Czech Union of Philatelists:

- The magazine Filatelie (48+4 pages) has been published every month (it has been published since 1950).
- Various specialised catalogues of postage and fiscal stamps from the Czech or Czechoslovak territory and historically nearby territories are published (usually twice in a decade).
- More than 20 titles of book Monographs dealing with philately (stamps and postal history) in the Czech and Czechoslovak territory have been published since 1968.
- Specialised societies covered by The Czech Union of Philatelists regularly publish bulletins related to their activities and keep their own websites.
- The EXPONET web portal is also operated under the auspices of the SČF. This currently displays more than 1130 philatelic exhibits and presentations from all over the world.

GERMANY

In terms of world politics, the past year will once again go down in the history books. While the Corona pandemic increasingly lost its horror in the Western world and the first events, even important philatelic fairs and exhibitions, took place again, an unfortunate war has been raging in Ukraine since February 2022 and has not ended to this day. There can be no talk of peace.

This indirectly affected the production of philatelic literature (not only this, of course!). This is because energy resources were made scarce by Russia, driving up world market prices for gas, oil, etc., as countries like Germany and many others had to stock up on energy elsewhere at much higher prices. The consequences were and still are massive price increases for almost all products, not only food but also printed products and paper, which became on average 30-40% more expensive. The cost of living rose massively and ultimately the whole scenario caused inflation to rise, reaching levels not seen in Germany for many decades. More than 10 percent in one year!

There is no end in sight to this spiral and no one knows - this report was written in early January 2023 - how it will continue. The danger of further increasing armed conflict with ever stronger military potential cannot be ruled out. Thus, this annual report is subject to many reservations and question marks. Nevertheless, the important philatelic exhibitions in various countries also gave reason for hope.

The following is a brief overview of the general literary situation in Germany.

1. Philatelic journals

There are still numerous trade journals in Germany: the "Briefmarken Spiegel" (BMS), the "Deutsche Briefmarken Revue" (DBR), the "Deutsche Briefmarken Zeitung"(DBZ), the "philatelie" and the "Michel-Rundschau". In my last annual report I had forgotten the "Junge Sammler" (JS), a magazine for young collectors published four times a year by the Deutsche Philatelisten-Jugend (DPhJ).

While the BMS, the DBR and the DBZ are commercial journals that are available in free trade, i.e. also at newsstands and in (railway station) bookshops, the "philatelie" is only distributed to members of the Federation of German Philatelists, the "JS" only to members of the DPhJ. With a circulation of approx. 20,000, "philatelie" is still the most widely distributed magazine, but a look back at the last few years also shows that the BDPh has lost around 20% of its members in two years (in 2020, the circulation was approx. 25,000 copies per month).



The situation described at the beginning has not left the publishing houses unscathed. The increases in production costs are having a sometimes drastic effect here as well. An example of this is the "Michel-Rundschau" (MiR), which has not only reduced the number of annual issues from 15 to 12, but has also significantly reduced the number pages of issues, while significantly increasing the subscription price. The bottom line is that the magazine is estimated to have become 30-40 per cent more expensive for readers. The increases are smaller for other journals, but the trends are comparable and there is no end in sight. The BMS states a print run of 10,400 copies, the DBZ of 7,750.

Also worth mentioning are the in-house magazines, apart from "MiR" this is "postfrisch", the magazine of Deutsche Postphilatelie. In addition, there is the "APHV-Magazin", the magazine of the Association of the Professional Philatelic Trade in Germany, six times a year.

Last but not least, the purely digitally distributed trade journals should also be mentioned this time. At least three have existed for several years, one even for more than ten years. "The Middle East Philatelic Bulletin" by Tobias Zywietz, "Angola Philatelie" by Reinhard Küchler and "PHILA HISTORICA" by Wolfgang Maassen. The latter with four issues per year and about 1,000 pages in length, which can be downloaded free of charge digitally as a pdf file from www.philahistorica.de. The fact that this research journal for everyone interested in the history of philately and philatelic literature was awarded gold at the FIP exhibition in London in February 2022 speaks for the content and quality of the information provided.

2. Reference books / monographs / research works

The estimated number of about 100 specialist publications for the years 2020 or 2021 should also have been almost reached in 2022. As before, the service providers include some very active working groups such as INFLA Berlin, Poststempelgilde and others, but also individual research groups and authors, some of whom have published very extensive, outstanding research works. In addition to these, a few commercial specialist publishers (e.g. the auction house Heinrich Köhler as well as Corinphila in Switzerland) are active with their book series "Edition d'Or / Edition Speciale" and the Phil*Creativ-Verlag with its series "Chronik der deutschen Philatelie" and enrich the philatelic literature landscape.

But price increases are not bypassing book production either. In the case of publications by commercial publishers, they average at least 20%, sometimes even higher. They are usually only lower if a work has received third-party funding.



3. Catalogues

First and foremost here is the Schwaneberger Verlag near Munich, which continues to be represented with a wide-ranging catalogue offering every year. The sales prices for the catalogues of the Europe and Overseas series have also been raised to the extent mentioned above, which is unlikely to contribute to an increase in sales. Yet the quality, especially of the special catalogues, is undisputed. At CAPE TOWN 2022 in November, three works by Schwaneberger Verlag alone received a gold medal (Deutschland Spezial, Volumes 1 + 2, Briefe-Katalog Deutschland).

The price of the so-called "Michel Junior" (now offered as "Michel Kompakt") was significantly increased and now costs 15 euros (2020: 9.90 euros). A similar work is the annual DNK (Deutschland-Netto-Katalog) published by the company Leuchtturm, which is also more expensive than in previous years, but "only" costs 12.95 euros.

You can see from these examples how the current situation of massively increased energy and paper prices in particular is causing problems for publishers. Inflation causes rising personnel and maintenance costs, which only makes the situation more difficult.

4. Working groups (study groups)

Here I can build on what I wrote last year, because the general situation has not changed significantly. Of course, inflation does not stop at these specialised research groups either; a few groups have disbanded due to age. But the fact that around 70 such groups have registered for IBRA 2023 with their own stand speaks for the unbroken drive of these study groups.

This can also be seen in the BDPh literature database (see:

https://www.bdph.de/index.php?id=34). This electronic database was introduced in 2005 with the first BDPh homepage. Before that, since 1945, the annual LITERATUR-Nachrichten had been published in printed form. Franz-Josef Lindauer, Soest, author of numerous volumes, has painstakingly digitised the LITERATUR-NACHRICHTEN for the years 1945-2004. However, these data are not included in this database. Why not is not clear. But the data since 2005 are also impressive, for the database contains 1,416 book reviews, 50,805 literature reports and 175 literature announcements by working groups. This unique database is supervised and massively supported by Rainer von Scharpen.

5. Philatelic libraries

Here, as before, are the Philatelic Library in Munich, those in Hamburg, Frankfurt and Wuppertal. They have reopened their doors to visitors since 2022. The situation of the Philatelic Library Munich has not improved due to the conversion of the previous building



at the Gasteig, which was planned by the city but has not yet been realised. Storage and stacks are now located elsewhere, the subsidies from the city have been reduced, so that the library has had to stop receiving many foreign periodicals. The Munich library cannot participate in IBRA 2023 for the reasons mentioned above, but Hamburg, Wuppertal and Frankfurt can. These are supported by income from sustaining members and sponsors. They will continue to have an important task in the future and therefore it is urgent to maintain their valuable contribution to all philatelists.

6. Exhibitions/Presentations

As in other countries, the first major philatelic events took place again in Germany in 2022. After the planned OSTROPA had been cancelled due to the Russian-Ukrainian war, all eyes turned to Ulm, the new location for the "Internationale Briefmarken-Börse" (IBB), which had previously been held annually in Sindelfingen at the end of October. Also thanks to the massive support of the Southwest Regional Association, led by Chairman Dieter Schaile, and in cooperation with the experienced fair organiser Jan Billion, it was possible to hold a comparatively high-level and well-attended event, which was again attended by many working groups and the Philatelic Library Hamburg. The German Old Letter Collectors' Association (DASV), along with the numerous dealers represented, contributed significantly to the success with their offers.

With IBRA 2023, the World Exhibition in Essen from 25-28 May, and the National Exhibition NAPOSTA 2023 in Trier in July, this will hopefully find a notable increase. The IBB in Ulm is also firmly scheduled for the end of October 2023.

7. Philatelic second-hand bookshops

For decades, "Philabooks", run by Burkhard Schneider in Frankfurt, was a leader. For well over half a year now, the antiquarian bookshop has been closed down and the website www.philabooks.com states: "Due to an illness of Mr Schneider, unfortunately only a very limited operation is possible at the moment. Unfortunately, orders cannot be accepted at the moment. As soon as a new situation arises, we will report here."

Obviously, nothing seems to have changed in this situation by the end of 2022 and it can only be hoped that Mr Schneider will recover. For his antiquarian bookshop in particular was also active in the distribution of new publications worldwide. For example, he also supplied the respective new publications of the Royal Philatelic Society London, which can now only be obtained from the society in London.



Thus, with the antiquarian bookshop of Phil*Creativ Verlag in Schwalmtal (see: www.philshop.de), there is currently only one left that is active. However, only for used older literature, not for new publications by other publishers. Via this antiquarian bookshop, noteworthy libraries of former collectors (e.g. of Rolf Rohlfs or Dr. Wolf Hess, among others) were liquidated in 2022; extensive holdings are still waiting for further processing.

A fundamental problem during the pandemic period was (and still is in some cases: see China!) the delivery of book parcels, which were often returned because they could not be delivered. More drastic are the parcel costs, which have risen year on year and are no longer affordable for many interested parties. If a book costs 40 euros but 50 euros to send overseas, it no longer makes sense. This has a lasting effect on the international distribution of philatelic literature.

8. Summary

There is light and shadow. What will prevail, the future will show. In 2022, the first buds of a new spring sprouted, but whether these will develop into strong blossoms is currently written in the stars.

With well over 185 exhibits, IBRA 2023 will certainly offer a show of philatelic literature that is unique in the world. It is worth visiting, especially as the literature area with 150 m^2 and with the participation of the philatelic libraries of Hamburg, Wuppertal and Frankfurt as well as a spacious well-located reading area is inviting.

In this area, two publishers (Heinrich Köhler, Wiesbaden and Phil*Creativ, Schwalmtal) will also show their literature, and at the more than 70 stands of the working groups, all of them will have their new literature - newsletters and special publications - in stock. This will make IBRA 2023 a "festival of literature lovers" the likes of which we have not seen in Germany for a long time.



HONG KONG by P.C. Shaw

Hong Kong Philatelic Society continues to publish the annual journal and the monthly newsletter in full colour in 2022. The 2022 journal (Issue no. 26) contains 178 pages with Snapshot of Society Activities 2021 and 18 articles on Research and Philatelic Interest of Hong Kong, Mainland China and International.

The Society is pleased to report that the 2020 journal (Issue no. 24) has obtained a Large Vermeil Award from Philanippon 2021 in August 2021 and a Gold Award cum Best Periodical from National Philatelic Literature Exhibition Christchurch New Zealand in November 2021.

NEW ZEALAND by Norman Banfield

A National Philatelic Literature Exhibition will be held on 25-27 November 2023 in Christchurch.

It is a National exhibition but with international exhibits invited - the same procedure as used for many years.

The first Crawford Festival was held at the premises of the Royal Philatelic Society London on 28 and 29 June 2022. This was a two-day event to celebrate philatelic literature, culminating in the awarding of the Crawford Medal for the best philatelic book. Over thirty publications were selected and these were reduced to a short list of eight candidates. The Crawford Medal Committee awarded the 2022 Crawford Medal to Guillermo F Gallegos FRPSL & Joseph Hahn for their publication 'The 19th Century issues of El Salvador 1867-1900'. Next year's festival will be held on 27-28 June 2023 where the theme will be early philatelic journals.

From 28 September to 1 October the UK National Exhibition, STAMPEX, took place in London. There were entries in the literature class: CAMEO, the journal of the West Africa Study Circle was awarded a Gold Medal.
